

## Frequently Asked Questions

### 1. What does "communication project" mean?

A communication project is an individual piece of work that you previously did for the purpose of putting a message across to a specific group of people. It can be a press article, a photo essay, a video or a radio documentary that conveys an idea related to an issue of humanitarian concern.

### 2. Must my communication project have been previously published?

No. Your communication project does not necessarily have to be published. It can be something you have produced for an organization / association / newspaper / radio / TV or a project you have undertaken in the course of your studies.

### 3. Can I submit a radio documentary?

Yes. The communication project can be a video, photo essay, article or radio documentary.

### 4. I did a communication project with one (or several) project partner(s). Can I submit our work?

No. This communication project must be an **individual** work so that we may be able to properly assess your skills and capacities.

### 5. How long should the project be?

There is no time or word limit. But we count on your common sense to keep documents to a reasonable size.

### 6. What is a good communication project?

Your communication project will be assessed on the originality of the topic and the approach, the relevance of the message, and the editorial quality.

### 7. I wrote a research paper on a humanitarian issue. Can I submit that paper?

No. A communication project is not a research paper. Rather, it should aim at getting a message across to a specific target group.

### 8. My communication project is not in English or in French. Can I submit a translated work?

Yes. Please send us a version in French or in English.

### 9. I don't have a previous humanitarian communication project, can I just make one now?

No. It must be a **previous** work.

### 10. What does a successful application need?

A successful application is an application that:

- a. complies with the age requirement (18-25),
- b. supplies proof of involvement in humanitarian/social services,
- c. is accompanied by a letter of recommendation from a relevant person confirming your interest in youth issues and humanitarian action,
- d. includes an original and well-structured communication project with a relevant message related to an issue of humanitarian concern.

### 11. I just turned 26. Can I still participate in the competition?

No. Under point 4 of the competition's terms and conditions, applicants cannot be older than 25 on 1 January 2011.

### 12. I work for the ICRC. Can I apply?

No. Under point 3 of the competition's terms and conditions, Movement staff and their families are not eligible.
